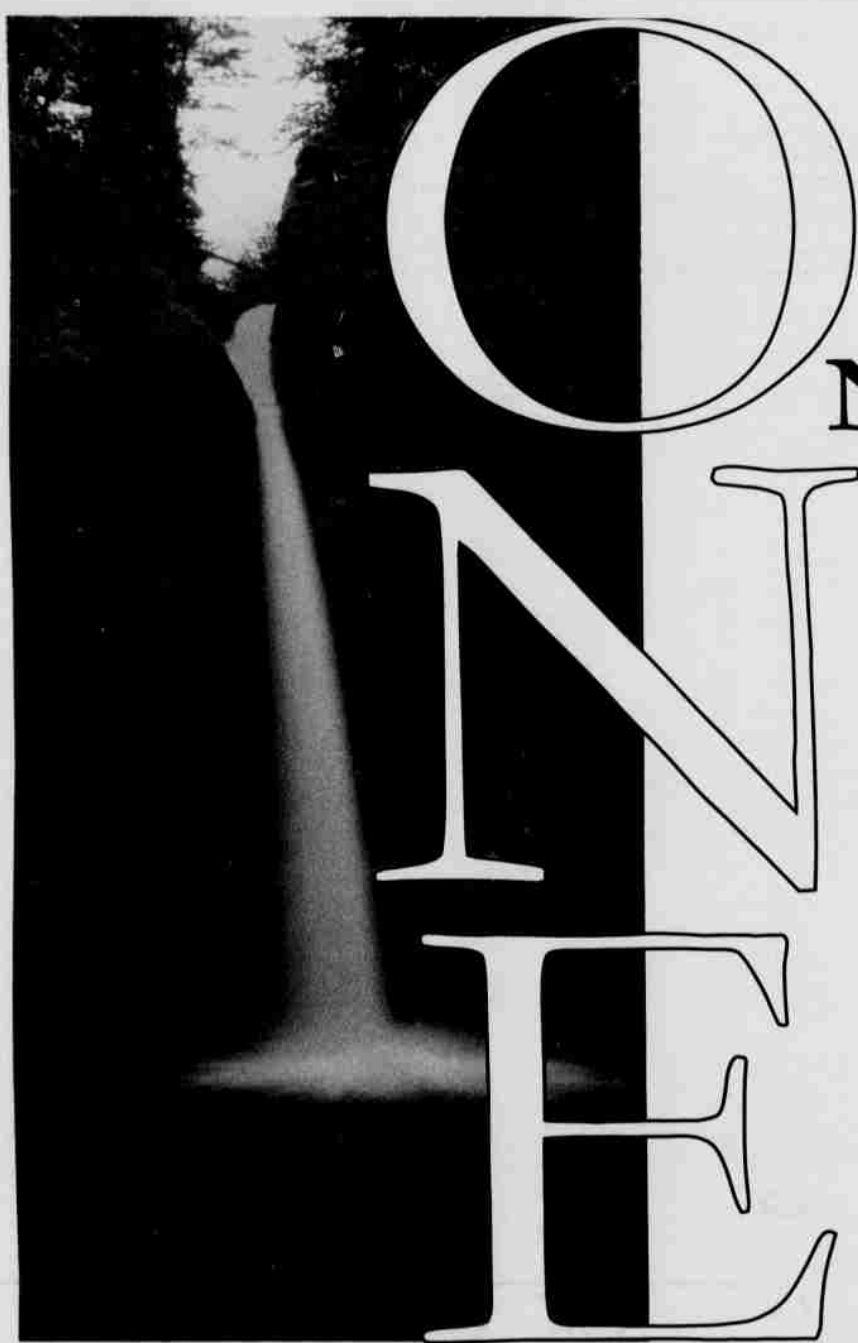




NE Chance to Stop the Gorge Casino
