SUMMONS (Notice of hearing regarding transfer
of jurisdiction)

To: SONJA HASKINS-MACK and THOMAS ETIER:

You are hereby summoned and required to appear and defend
the Petition filed for transfer of jurisdiction in the above-numbered
proceeding from state court (Multnomah County) to Tribal Court by
appearing at the time and place specified below.

A TRANSFER HEARING WILL BE HELD ON: Wednesday, May
7, 2008, at 1:30 p.m., at the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde,
Juvenile Court, which is located at 9615 Grand Ronde Road, Grand
Ronde, OR 97347, wherein the Court will hear evidence and issue an
order concerning a child whose date of birth is 7/12/06.

TO THE PARENTS OR GUARDIAN: Your rights may be af-
fected. The child custody proceeding may be transferred from state
court (Multnomah County) to Tribal Court, and if you fail to appear
at the time and place specified above, the state and/or Tribal Court
may order transfer and accept jurisdiction, and take any other action
that is authorized by law.

You have the right to be present at the hearing, to present evidence,
and to be represented by an attorney. If you have any questions, you
should seek an attorney immediately. If you cannot afford an attorney,
one may be appointed for you at the Tribe's expense upon your request
and upon the courts' determination of indigence. You may call the
Tribal Court at 503-879-2303 or toll-free at 800-422-0232. Failure to
appear may result in a judgment by default against you for the relief
demanded in the Petition and may affect your rights. The Court may
proceed with this hearing whether or not you are present.

AMENDMENT TO LIQUOR ORDINANCE

The Tribal Council, in consultation with the Tribal Attorney's Of-
fice, has proposed amendments to the Liquor Ordinance. A First
Reading of the proposed amendments was conducted at the April
16, 2008, Tribal Council Meeting.

The proposed amendments will remove restrictions on service of
alcohol in areas of the casino where gaming is taking place. The
amendments are necessary if SMGI pursues plans to build a Sports
Bar with table top gaming devices or wishes to expand its alcohol
service in the future. The amendment will allow the service in
gaming areas provided that Council has authorized the service by
resolution.

The proposed Liquor Ordinance amendments include the follow-
ing:

(1) Section (d)(1)(C) is modified to read as follows:

"(C) Liquor may be served in rooms where gambling is taking place
if authorized by Tribal Council resolution."

(2) Section (i) is modified to read as follows:

"(i) **CONSISTENCY WITH STATE LAW:** The Tribe will com-
ply with Oregon Liquor Laws to the extent required by 18 U.S.C.
1161."

AMENDMENT TO TRIBAL COUNCIL ORDINANCE

The Tribal Council, in consultation with the Tribal Attorney's
Office, has proposed amendments to the Tribal Council Ordinance.
A First Reading of the proposed amendments was conducted at the
April 16, 2008, Tribal Council Meeting.

The proposed amendments eliminate conflicts between the Tribal
Council Ordinance and the Tribal Council Travel Policy modifica-
tions approved at the April 2, 2008, Tribal Council meeting by
providing that Tribal Council travel is subject to the Tribal Coun-
cil Travel Policy, rather than detailing those policies in the Tribal
Council Ordinance.

The proposed Tribal Council Ordinance amendments include the
following:

(1) paragraph (k) is amended to read:

"(k) **TRAVEL POLICY:** Tribal Council members traveling on of-
ficial business shall be subject to the Tribal Council Travel Policy, as
may be modified from time to time by Tribal Council resolution.";

(2) sections (k)(1)-(2) and (k)(4) are deleted in their entirety;
and

(3) other technical corrections that may be necessary.
