▲ Tribal member Bianca Rose, 17, worked with the Publications Department taking photos and learning the basics of design on the *Smoke Signals* newsletter.

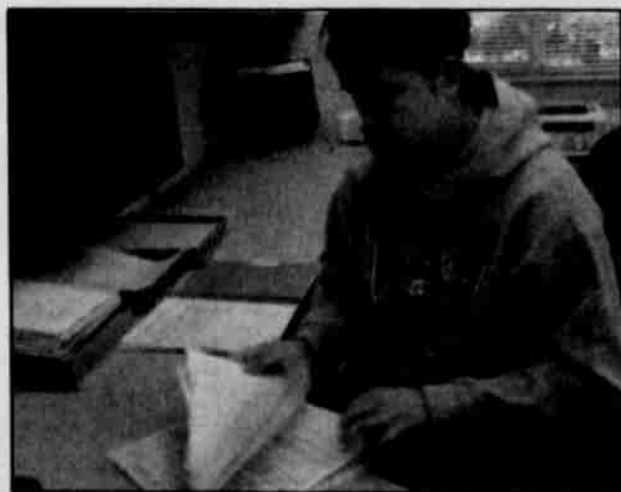
