## Work workshop

More than 40 Tribal and community members attended the Oregon Department of Transportation workforce information workshop held in the Adult Education building on the Tribal campus on Thursday, Feb. 19. A panel of people from the highway construction industry spoke about what it's like working in the trade, employment opportunities, apprenticeship programs and other topics.



**2004** — Tribal staff are seeking a \$500,000 Indian Community Block Grant to help fund a two-year, \$3.2 million project to widen Grand Ronde Road to make it safer for pedestrians, bicyclists and drivers.

**1999** — Cemetery groundskeeper Russell Leno says that the Tribal cemetery is being used disrespectfully by some who are driving through the grounds at night. "We know because the next day I found tire marks all through the graves," he says. Leno says Tribal Council might have to consider locking the cemetery's gates at night.

**1994** — The Tribe receives a \$270,000 U.S. Department of Urban and Housing Development Indian Community Block Grant to help build a 5,000-gallon steel water storage tank on the ridge north of Highway 18 across from the proposed Spirit Mountain Development resort site.

**1989** — Tribal member Chuck Williams helps christen Multnomah County's newest river patrol boat, Chief Tumalth, on the shores of the Columbia River. Williams is a descendant of Tumalth, who signed the 1855 Willamette Valley Treaty representing the Wal-lalla band of the Tumwaters, later known as the Cascades. The boat is the fifth in the county Sheriff's Office fleet to be named after Pacific Northwest Indian leaders.

**1984** — Eight of the nine-member Interim Tribal Council spend a day in orientation to the Bureau of Indian Affairs programs, personnel, branches and services in Portland.

## Casino rings in March with boxing matches

Portland's best known boxer and former International Boxing Federation super featherweight champion Steve Forbes (33-7, 9 KOs) takes on Jason Davis (11-2, 3 KOs) of Vancouver, Wash., on Friday, March 6, at Spirit Mountain Casino in a 10-round welterweight main event dubbed the "Border War."

The Forbes-Davis clash is just one of three fights that night featuring Oregon boxers taking on foes from Washington.

Coming back to Oregon for the first time since defending his light heavyweight world title in the Rose Garden seven years ago is eight-time world champion Roy Jones Jr., who is promoting the seven-fight card through his company, Square Ring Inc., and will be ringside for the action.

Tickets for the debut boxing event at Spirit Mountain Casino Events Center are \$25, \$35, \$50, \$75 and \$100 through Star Tickets Plus and can be purchased online at starticketplus.com or by calling 800-585-3737. The Events Center has a seating capacity of 1,744. Excellent seats can be purchased at the casino's Coyote Club desk and www.spiritmountain.com. Doors open at 7 p.m. with the first bout starting at 8 p.m.

Also on the bill are Portland's Robert Brue (5-0, 3 KOs) against fellow light-heavyweight Roger Cantrell (13-1, 8 KOs) of Tacoma, Wash., in a six-round bout, and Marco Canderos of Salem taking on Manuel Ortega or Seattle, two featherweights making their pro debuts in a four-round match. ■
