Tribal member Robert Corritore, 18, graduated from Sacred Heart Cathedral Preparatory in San Francisco and has been accepted to attend Xavier University in Ohio, where he will major in business economics with a minor in history.

Xavier is ranked among the top 10 universities in the Midwest by U.S. News & World Report, including a rank of second in 2008.

In high school, Corritore's leadership abilities dramatically evolved because of his involvement in football and track and field.

He woke up at 4:30 a.m. daily to attend football practice, which developed his dedication. The team won its first state championship in school history due to the influence and dedication of the coaches.

"He has learned many valuable lessons and one is that the success an individual achieves is measured by the amount of effort they put into it," says his mother, Hilary.
