Summer internships for high school students

The Apprenticeships in Science and Engineering (ASE) Program matches high school students interested in the sciences with mentors for an eight-week paid summer internship. CMOP internships provide a \$1,000 stipend to the student, as well as an experience that will provide professional training and looks great on college and job applications. Students from low-income families (qualify for the federal free or reduced lunch program) will receive a \$2,000 stipend.

We are seeking Native American high school students for four summer internship positions with the Center for Coastal Margin Prediction and Observation (CMOP). There are four positions: Carbon Cycling in the Columbia River Estuary, Environmental Sensor Development, Internship in Ocean Observatories and Remediation of Environmental Contaminants.

Students must submit a preliminary application form, two letters of recommendation from adults, a copy of their official school transcripts, an essay targeted for their desired positions (up to three positions), a final application form and a \$25 application fee.
