

Museum receives \$75,000 grant to re-install gallery

Willamette University's Hallie Ford Museum of Art was awarded a \$75,000 Access to Artistic Excellence grant from the National Endowment for the Arts to support re-installation of the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde Gallery.

The Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde endowed the museum's Native American gallery, which exhibits a sampling of Pacific Northwest Indian basket weaving traditions, in 1999.

This is the largest federal grant the Hallie Ford Museum of Art has received and work will include new lighting, casework, colors and interpretation, conservation of a number of objects, public programs and production of a gallery guide.

"We are thrilled to receive an NEA grant and look forward to completing the renovation of the gallery, which houses our collection of Native American art, by next spring," said John Olbrantz, director of the Hallie Ford Museum of Art.

The Grand Ronde Gallery is the fourth and final permanent gallery at the museum slated for renovation. ■
