If so, please let us know! We need a picture of you for our Graduates' Slideshow that will be shown at the CTGR Graduation Ceremony on June 25.

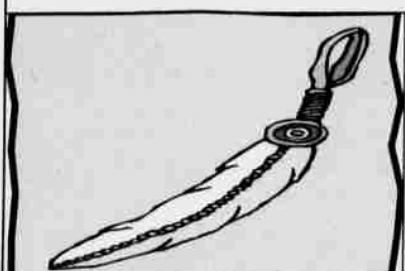
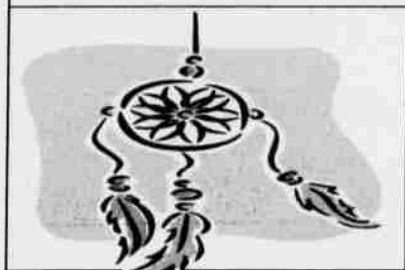

Wildlife Society program for Natives

The Professional Development Program for Native American Students Interested in the Wildlife Profession is open to all Native American, Alaska Natives, First Nations, Native Hawaiian or Indigenous Tribal students currently enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate program studying natural resources or natural resource management. This competitive program will provide travel grant funds to enable students to attend the 17th annual Conference of the Wildlife Society, to be held in Snowbird, Utah, Oct. 2-6, 2010. Selected individuals will receive \$1,500 each to help cover registration fees, lodging, meals and transportation to the conference. In addition, program participants will receive one-year TWS and NPWMWG memberships, TWS publications including The Wildlife Professional and The Wildlifer as well as discounts on The Journal of Wildlife Management and access to TWS online resources.

The National Center for Cooperative Education in Natural Resources program

1) Students accepted to the program receive tuition assistance (\$5,000/year), summer employment and noncompetitive conversion to BIA or Tribal positions upon graduation.

2) Tribes and BIA units are eligible to hire students for summer and permanent positions. For summer employment, the Bureau of Indian Affairs provides \$4,000 toward each student's salary.
