The Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde will be hosting its Annual Contest Powwow on Aug. 20-22, 2010.

We would like to invite you to apply for a booth space at our powwow. Native preference will be considered. The Powwow Committee requires authentic/quality items at the powwow. No weapons of any kind allowed. The Powwow Committee has the right to jury any questionable items. There are no day rates or refunds.

Craft vendors will each be allowed a 15 X 20 space. Craft vendors may apply for a maximum of two vendor spaces. There will be no exceptions. If your vendor set up will exceed the two spaces there is no guarantee that you will be able to set up and there are no refunds. A maximum of 50 craft vendors and 15 food vendors will be accepted. No vehicles will be allowed to be parked directly with your vendor booth.

Food vendors do not have the same space limitation as craft vendors. Please indicate on your application the size of your vendor set up.

In order to encourage more participation of Native vendors, the committee gives a discount to Native vendors who can show proof of Tribal enrollment.

2005 — Tribal member and Chief Warrant Officer Ronald Bly took command as officer in charge of Mobile Mine Assembly, Detachment 12, in Misawa, Japan. The son of Roger and Betty Bly, he assumed all duties as group commander for Naval Mining Operations in the northwestern Pacific Ocean.

2000 — The Benton County Museum honored Tribal Elder Merle Holmes during the annual Historic Preservation Awards ceremony for donating his time to countless students and researchers striving for an accurate picture of Tribal life in western Oregon.

1995 — Spirit Mountain Development Corp. hired two new members to the management team. Dave Harjo was brought on as vice president of development and Shancy Saban was hired to be office manager.

1990 — Enrollment Director Margo Mercier reported that 80 new Tribal member enrollees increased Tribal membership to 2,646.

1985 — The Tribe entered into negotiations with the Bureau of Land Management for approximately 20,000 acres to form a new Reservation. Slightly more than 10,000 acres form a solid block of land four miles north of Grand Ronde.
