Aug. 9, 1942–July 9, 2010

Judith Ann Drake passed away in Grand Ronde, Ore., on July 9, 2010, at the age of 67.

Judith was born Aug. 9, 1942, in Portland, Ore., to Leroy and Evelyn (Shepherd) Ault. She lived in the Portland area before moving to Bay City, Ore., in 1972. On Feb. 4, 1984, Judi and Keith Drake were married in Carson City, Nev. In 2008, they relocated to Grand Ronde.

Judi was an accomplished seamstress (skills she honed as mother to 10 children!), and enjoyed crochet and quilting as well. She loved to read, and was a fan of crime and cooking television programs. She always maintained a garden and was a very good cook. One of her main interests was Native American culture, and she made ribbon dresses and shirts for the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde. Most important of all to her was her family and the time they spent together.

2010-11 special youth hunt tag opportunity

The Fish & Wildlife Department will hold A SPECIAL tag drawing for 1 (ONE) TRASK UNIT YOUTH ELK TAG for ONE ANTERLESS ELK on TUESDAY AUG. 31, 2010, at 4 p.m. at the Natural Resources facility, located at 47010 S.W. Hebo Road, Grand Ronde.

Application rules:

■ Tribal hunting licenses are required before submitting applications with the exception that Tribal members 11 years of age may apply. However, they must turn 12 by the start of that hunt and have their Hunter Safety Certificate.

■ Incomplete or duplicate applications will be VOIDED.

■ Tribal members under 18 years of age must possess a valid Hunter Safety Certificate.

Tribal licenses are issued at the Natural Resources Division. Please call for an appointment to ensure that an authorized staff member is available to issue licenses. Tribal Enrollment Cards and Hunter Safety Certificates for youth under 18 are required at the time of licensing.

ONLY ONE APPLICATION PERMITTED. Multiple applications will result in applications being VOIDED for that hunter. Any licensed Tribal member between the ages of 12-17 may apply. YOUTH MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN ADULT AT LEAST 21 YEARS OF AGE.

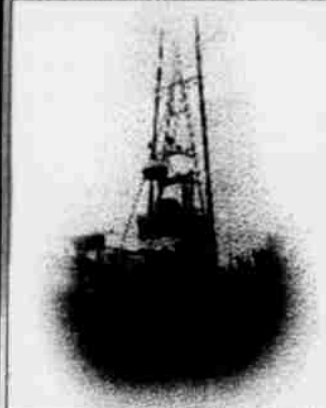
