Early bird applicants are entered into a \$500 scholarship drawing just for turning their application in early.


It's FAFSA time!

A requirement of the Tribe's full-time Higher Education programs is that students apply for federal aid. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form for 2011-12 is available online at www. fafsa.gov. Should students be eligible, federal student aid can help pay for tuition, books and fees, and may include a portion of your living expenses.

The deadline is Feb. 15 to have your applications in for Summer or Fall Term/Semester students. Please send a copy of your completed FAFSA and/or a copy of your Student Aid Report (SAR) to the Tribal Education Division as soon as possible. You can file your FAFSA before you file taxes. Remember, this is a free application. Never pay someone to fill out your FAFSA for you. This is a popular scam!
