- Current high school sophomore, junior, or senior (priority will be given to sophomore/junior students)
- Grand Ronde Tribal member
- Reside in Oregon
- Female
- GPA of at least a 2.5 (accumulative) or 3.0 in previous term
- Good attendance record (fewer than 4 unexcused absences in the previous term)
- Good behavior (student must demonstrate maturity and good decision making skills — students who have had any discipline referrals in the past 3 months must submit an appeal to have her application read)
