They will participate in football, basketball, weightlifting, traditional games, dance and more, as well as learn about team building, wellness, healthy lifestyle choices, leadership, culture and spirituality.

The academy is open to Native youth 12 to 18 years of age who want to create and maintain a healthy life and who are drug-, alcohol- and violence-free.

Cost is \$475, which includes lodging, all meals, training sessions, a T-shirt, activities and all special events.
