Covers signed numbers, elementary algebraic expression manipulation and equation solving. Describes concepts using verbal, numerical, graphic, and symbolic forms. Scientific calculator required. Prerequisite: MTH020 with a grade of C or better, or equivalent course as determined by instructor; or consent of instructor.
