Course Description: Prepares students to become active and efficient participants in the learning process. Encourages students to build and employ a collection of effective learning strategies necessary to meet the learning challenges of academic and career settings. Develops note taking, listening, textbook study-reading, time management, test-taking and concentration and memory strategies. Focuses on reducing test anxiety and procrastination, Identifies campus resources and learning preferences.

Covers signed numbers, elementary algebraic expression manipulation and equation solving. Describes concepts using verbal, numerical, graphic and symbolic forms. Scientific calculator required. Prerequisite: MTH020 with a grade of C or better, or equivalent course as determined by instructor; or consent of instructor.

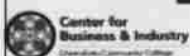

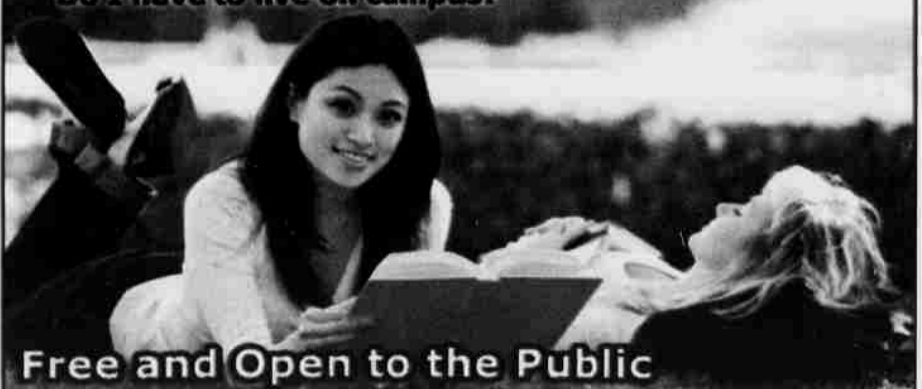
