OSAC scholarships

The Oregon Student Assistance Commission is now accepting applications for the 2012 process. OSAC administers more than 400 scholarships through their single application for Oregon students. Students who are members of Oregon Tribes and live out of state are also eligible to apply if they plan on attending college in Oregon. Visit <http://getcollegefunds.org/eApp.html> to apply. This application has an early bird deadline of Feb. 16, 2012, and a final deadline of March 1. Early bird applicants are entered into a \$500 scholarship drawing just for turning their application in early.

AISES summer internships

The AISES Internship Program provides students with applied work experience and an opportunity to explore career options.

Placing students in 10-week summer positions with partner agencies, the program also promotes advanced study to the graduate level and assists students in developing professional networks.

The deadline to apply to the 2012 AISES summer internship program is Feb. 15.

Graduate Horizons is a four-day admissions workshop for American Indian, Alaskan Native and Native Hawaiian college students, college graduates, and master's students who are preparing to apply for graduate school or professional school. It will be held June 16-19, 2012, at Harvard University. For more information and to apply, visit www.graduatehorizons.org. The 2012 application deadline is Feb. 6.

College Horizons is for current 10th- and 11th-grade high school students. Students have the opportunity to attend one of two locations and an opportunity to talk with admissions officers from 50 different colleges/universities from across the nation, learn about the college admissions process and learn about financial aid for college. Chafee Education and Training Grant

The Chafee Education & Training Grant deadline for Spring Term 2012 is Feb. 1. Applicants must currently be in foster care, or have been in foster care for at least 180 days (6 months) after their 14th birthday and exited substitute care at age 16 or older and participate in the voucher program by their 21st birthday. 
Best Buy scholarship
