### Eligibility is as follows:

- ◆ Current high school sophomore, junior or senior (priority will be given to sophomore/junior students);
- ◆ Male Grand Ronde Tribal member who currently resides in the state of Oregon;
- ◆ GPA of at least a 2.5 (accumulative) or 3.0 in previous term;
- ◆ Good attendance record (fewer than 4 unexcused absences in the previous term);
- ◆ Good behavior (student must demonstrate maturity and good decision-making skills – students who have had any discipline referrals in the past 3 months must submit an appeal to have her application read).

### Commitment:

- ◆ Student must commit to being present throughout the entire internship experience (June 3-23, 2012);
- ◆ Student must present to the Grand Ronde community following the trip to New York (sometime between July and September of 2012);
- ◆ Student must present to the incoming interns/participants prior to their departure the following year (approx. May of 2013).

All portions of the completed application must be returned to CTGR Youth Education Program by 5 p.m. Wednesday, March 21, 2012.
