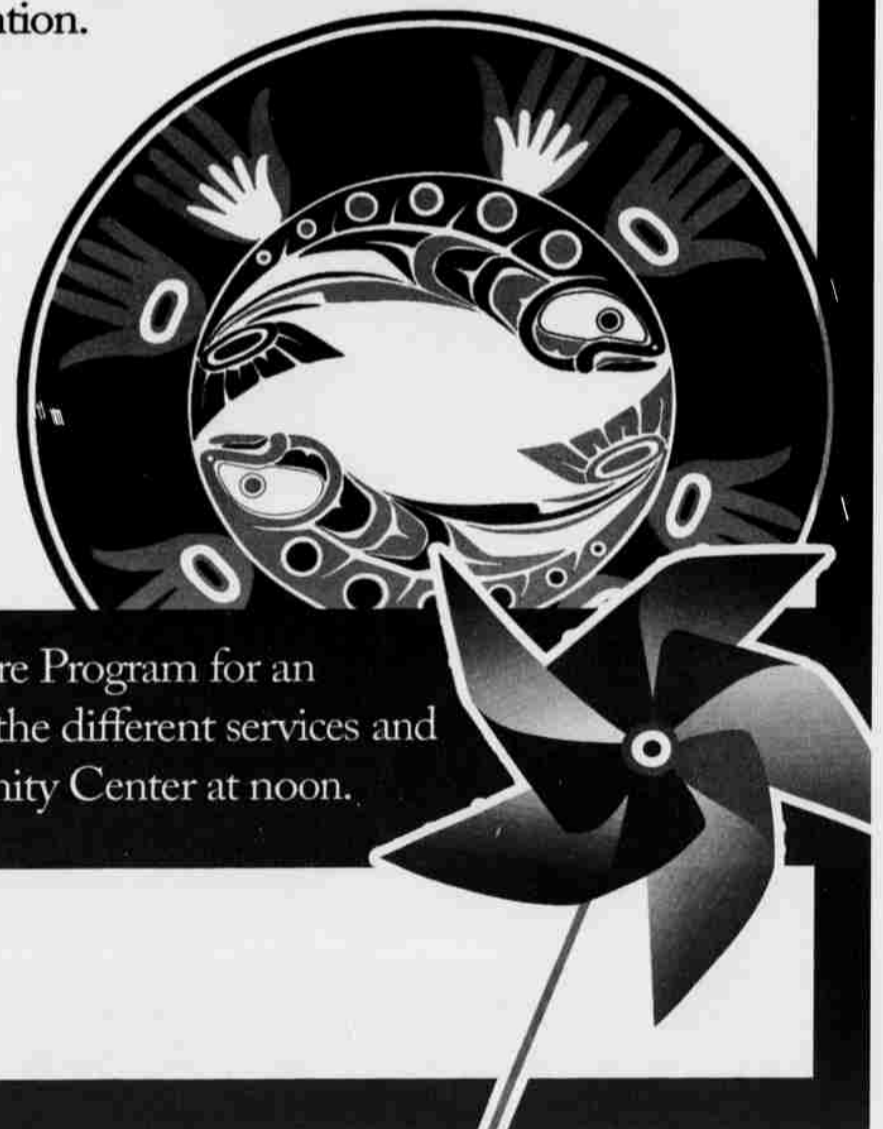
The Entire Month of April:
