#### WRITING 090 (Fundamentals of Writing) - CRN# 38348 Cost: \$360 + book(s)

Reinforces grammar and sentence-level editing skills in the context of paragraphs and short essays. Covers critical reading of college-level texts. Prerequisite: Placement into WR090; or WR049 or WR080, either with grade of C or better; or consent of instructor.

**Tribal Library Summer Programs:** 

<u>Reading Incentive Program:</u> We had 44 youth registered for the program and had 16 active readers. These 16 readers read 277 books over the six-week period. Eleven readers completed the program by reading 10 or more books. Congratulations to all of our readers!

Theme Activity Sessions: Sessions were held on June 23 and July 14 for ages 5-12. We had three and five participants, respectively, in each of the sessions. Youth learned about nocturnal animals and their habits, the stars, moon and planets, as well as making some creative projects like bat puppets, owl window art, solar system models and Native American moon calendars.

Sessions were scheduled on July 5 and 26 for ages 13-17, but we did not have any participants for those sessions.

<u>Collaborative Events</u>: We have teamed with the Sheridan and Willamina public libraries to host several evening sessions at each of the libraries in September, October and November. # **New CCRLS service**

Chemeketa Cooperative Regional Library Service and the Grand Ronde Tribal Library will partner in a new project to provide access to CCRLS material through the Grand Ronde Tribal Library.
