At park entrance, go straight into park and follow signs to RV camping. Go to RV Loop Meeting Hall and camping area. There should be a camp host for questions. Tell them you are with the RV Group; I have paid for up to 10 camping sites, additional nine or 10 sites available for \$5 per night. Additional vehicles are \$5 a day or use Oregon State Parks Pass, which can be purchased at park. Additional public camping area is available if we go over 20 in our group area.

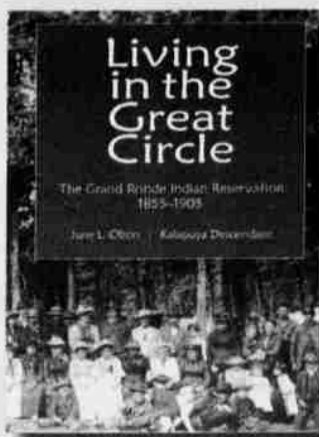
