Tsunami debris

Attention Tribal members gathering along the Oregon Coast, debris from the tsunami continues to be spotted on northwest coastlines. Under normal circumstances it would be highly encouraged to remove the debris and recycle as much as possible. However, if you are uncertain of what the item is or think it may be a remnant of the devastating tsunami, do not physically contact the debris. Instead contact the appropriate authorities using this wallet card.

TSUNAMI DEBRIS
POTENTIAL HAZARDOUS MATERIAL
 Oil/Chemical drums, gas cans, propane tanks.
 Call 211 and report location and description.

LITTER & MARINE DEBRIS
 Plastic bottles, aluminum cans, buoys, foam.
 If practical, remove and dispose/recycle.

LARGE AMOUNTS OF DEBRIS, OR DEBRIS WITH LIVING ORGANISMS ATTACHED
 Move debris with organisms above high tide, or throw away. Email date, location & photos to beach.debris@state.or.us or call 211.

ABANDONED VESSEL, SHIPPING CONTAINER
 Call 911 in an emergency. If the debris is a hazard to navigation, call 211.

PERSONAL ITEMS
 If can be traced to a person/group or has dollar value call 211 or email beach.debris@state.or.us
