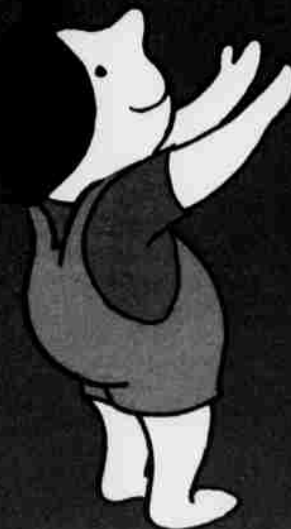
## Go Shopping!
