Housing Authority hosting Healthy Homes workshops

The Tribe will host two workshops on Monday, March 11, presented by the Environmental Protection Agency's Region 10 that will discuss Lead Awareness and Healthy Homes.

The workshops will be held from 9 a.m. to noon and 1 to 4 p.m. in the Housing Authority's Board Conference Room, 28450 Tyee Road.

Topics to be covered include the history and dangers of lead-based paint, disclosure notifications, the Renovation, Repair and Painting Rule that places new requirements on property management companies, landlords, contractors, renovators and painters; the keys to creating healthy homes and schools; indoor air quality, wood smoke and mold; understanding asthma triggers; pesticides, contaminants and toxic products; and tips to maintain a healthy environment.

There also will be a demonstration of an X-ray fluorescence analyzer and participants are encouraged to bring items of concern from home to be tested for lead.

Capitol to host Tribal Governments Legislative Day

SALEM – The State Capitol will host Oregon Tribal Governments Legislative Day from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Wednesday, Feb. 20, to allow elected representatives from Oregon's nine federally recognized Tribes to meet with elected state officials during the current legislative session.

The day is a chance for elected Tribal governmental officials to share information about their governments with legislators, Capitol staff, state agencies and the public.

The day will start with a morning reception in the Galleria and Tribes will have informational tables available from 9 a.m. to noon. At 10, members of the Legislative Commission on Indian Services, which includes Grand Ronde Tribal Council member Cheryl A. Kennedy, and other Tribal leaders will visit with legislators and hold brief meetings for introductions and a summary of Tribal governmental issues and priorities.

From noon to 1 p.m., Tribal government presentations will be held for state agency employees to hear while eating a brown bag lunch and a tour of the State Capitol will be held at 1 p.m.

The event does not replace Tribal Government Day, usually held in May, which is open to the public. ■
