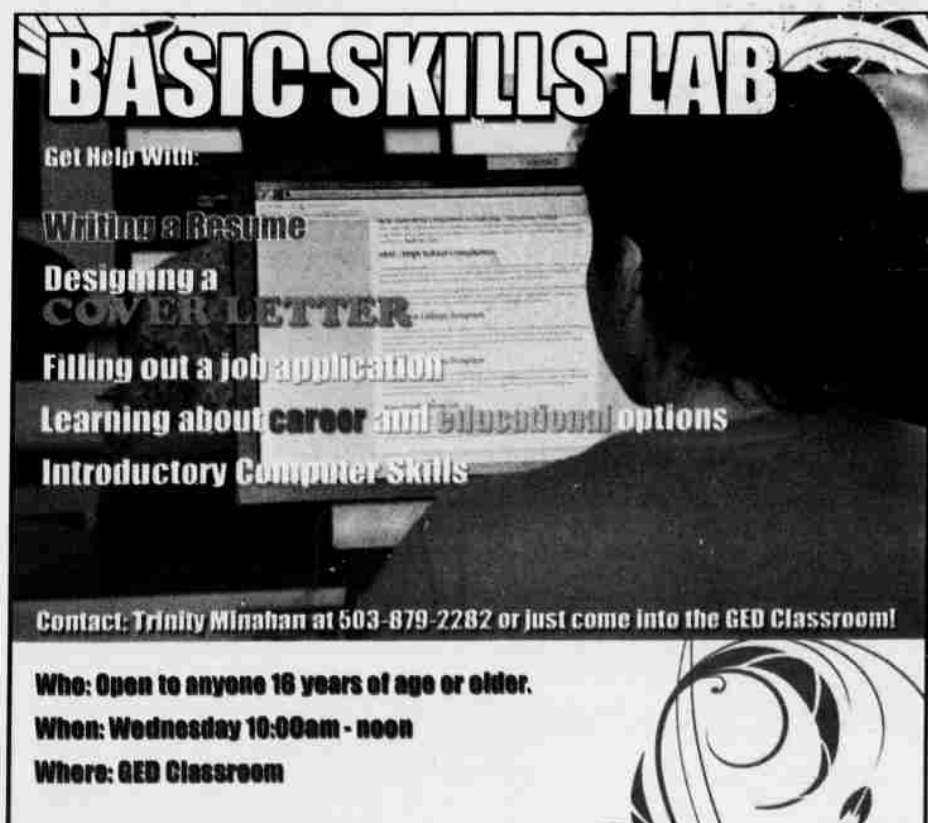

Beginning Thursday, Feb. 7, and on Thursdays from then on, the Tribal Library will offer personal learning tutorials on a number of computer-related topics to interested individuals. 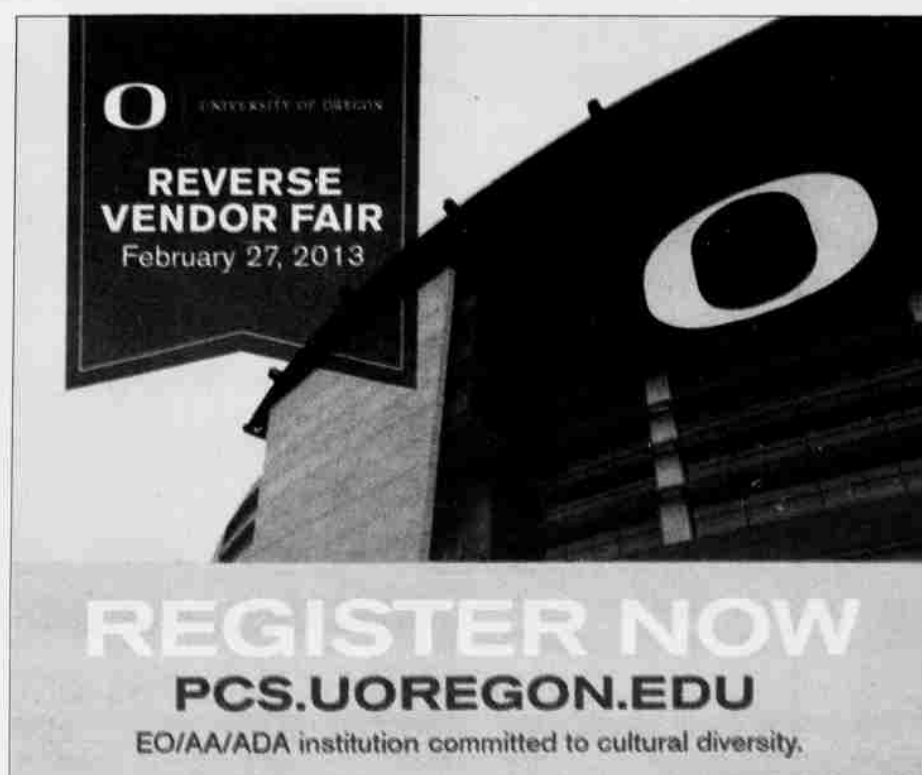
