position will move to offices on the second floor at Adult Education.

Three employees from the Tribe's Economic Development Department, currently housed in Finance on the first floor of the Governance Building, will move to the second floor offices vacated by Planning and Grants.

The Telecom Department, which had been housed in the Telecom modular south of the Governance Center, is moving to the Information Systems offices on the first floor of the Governance Building.

No plans have been announced for future use of the Telecom modu-

lar, White said.

"Basically," White said, "we're trying to get staff who work together to be located near each other for better time management, better interaction."

The moves have been in the works for the last couple of months, White said. "We're hoping to have it all done by end of March."

The project "seems like it involved half the staff here. Not just the 20 to 30 staff being moved, but also Procurement and Facilities are playing a big part, and Telecom as well."

"We're trying to take care of all the things people need, and not just stuffing them into a corner. It's always a lot more work than you think," White said. ■
