Presidential visit

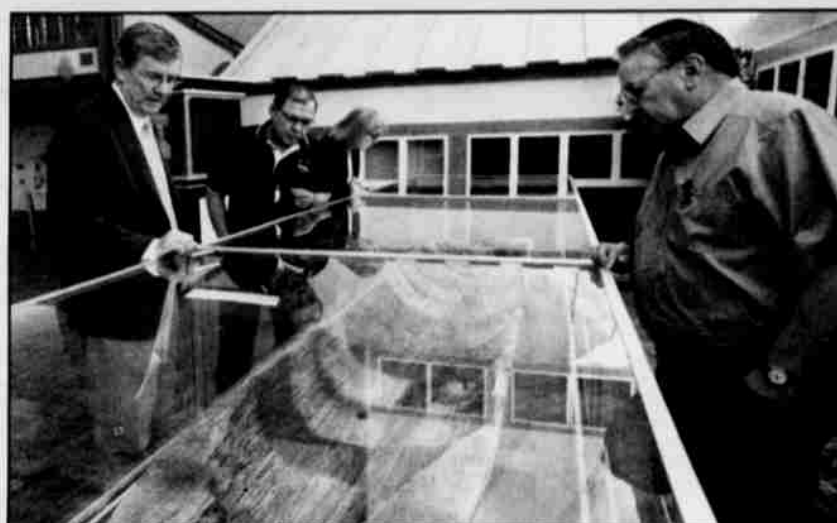
