Stampede set for July 20-21 at **Rodeo Grounds**

Dedication will honor longtime board member Dale Langley

orthwest Professional Rodeo Association competitors will return to Grand Ronde on Saturday and Sunday, July 20-21, to compete in the annual Spirit Mountain Stampede at the Spirit Mountain Rodeo Grounds on the Tribal campus.

Competition is scheduled to start at 1 p.m. both days as cowboys and cowgirls will compete in bull riding, steer wrestling, saddle and bareback bronc riding, tie-down roping, breakaway roping, team roping and barrel racing.

Winners of the rough stock bronc and bull riding events will win \$1,800 in addition to a portion of the entry fees while winners of the timed events will receive \$1,300 and a portion of the entry fees.

"Slack events" - for contestants who did not qualify for the Saturday and Sunday competitions - will be held at 5 p.m. Friday, July 19. Admission on Friday is free.

There also will be open events for children along with donkey races for adults.

The Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde hosted the NPRA-sanctioned event from 1996


