

It was not to commemorate the re-establishment of the Grand Ronde Reservation, which occurred on Sept. 9, 1988, when President Ronald Reagan signed the Grand Ronde Reservation Act into law, returning 9,811 acres to the Tribe.
- An article in the July 1 edition incorrectly reported that Tribal Elder and World War II veteran Gene Hudson participated in the D-Day invasion.
