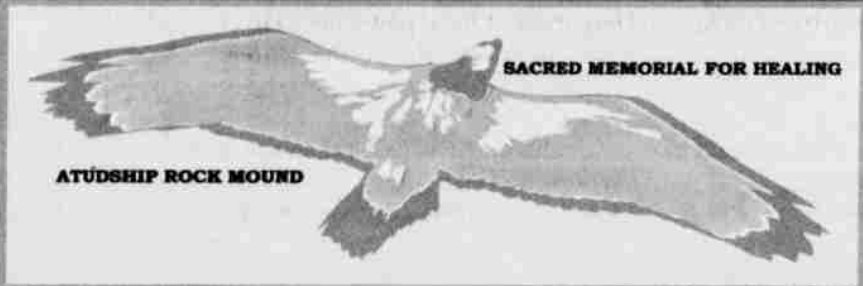

ATÚSHIP ROCK MOUND

SACRED MEMORIAL FOR HEALING

HONORING THE JOURNEY AND RESTORATION
OF THE MORE THAN 27 TRIBES AND BANDS OF
THE CONFEDERATED TRIBES OF THE GRAND RONDE COMMUNITY OF OREGON

This Atúship serves as a place for healing as our ancestors before us sought healing. It is a practice that has been in place since time immemorial. These stones have been collected from the Tribe's ancestral homelands and represent our connection to them. You may select a healing stone and place it on the mound. By doing so may the offering provide the healing that you seek. Please honor our place of rest for those who have walked on and be respectful of this sacred area. No photographs are permitted and we ask that you do not remove any items.

Atúship is a Tualatin Kalapuya word meaning to heap up earth and stone to gain spirit power. This practice was done by all of the tribes that were brought to the Grand Ronde Reservation. The *Atúship* at the Grand Ronde Cemetery will be for the membership to heal and gain the strength to remember.

All are welcome to join in the creation of this *Atúship*.

November 6th at 11:00 a.m. there will be a gathering to place the altar stones.

November 22nd at 10:00 a.m. will be the ceremony dedicating the memorial and presenting it to the membership and community.
