Just to name a few that our Department were part of: 338 acres of ceded land acquired; several properties converted into trust; lands data base improved; the first annual Tribal History Conference hosted; several large culture exhibits, including the first ever displayed at our pow wow; 104 cultural events; expansion of culture education class offerings; new culture class videos produced; Culture and Chachalu museum webpages developed; regular Land and Culture page printed in Smoke Signals; an amazing Canoe Journey and new canoe; the launch of the Chachalu Museum and Cultural Center capital campaign; successful growth of Cultural Protection services; a new Oral History Project started; BPA training provided by the Tribe; Veteran's Summit; a stellar 30th Restoration Celebration; Ceded Lands Plan scoping, research, and mapping completion; Plankhouse Ceremonies, including the recent Coming of Age Ceremony; new large carvings; Salmon Celebration; the First Fish Ceremony; and creation of the Atudship Monument and Healing Ceremony.
