The concept behind the compact disc was sparked when Ellen Bello, Native American Music Awards and Association founder, was invited by the Endangered Species Coalition to contribute to their book "Wild Success: The Endangered Species Act at 40."

"Wolf" was released Jan. 16 for \$9.99 both in hard copies and as an instant download on the NAMA Web site at www.namalive.com.

Reibach joined other Native artists such as the Gray Wolf Blues Band, Joanne Shenandoah, Painted Raven and Silverwolf in donating a track to the CD. ■
