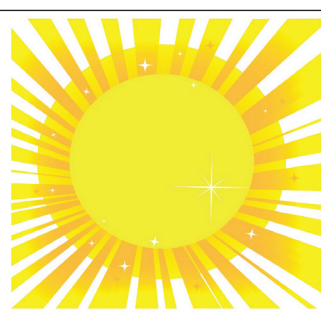
CTGR Eula Petite Scholarship
