- Raffle ticket for one of two blankets to be raffled every six months

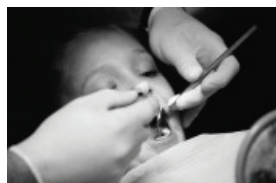
Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde Dental Clinic
