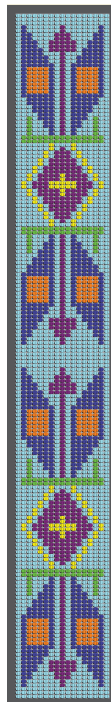

Hood Community College in Gresham. Also named among the 25 Under 25 group was SuSun Fisher, 15, daughter of Tammy Fisher. She is a member of the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians and active in the Grand Ronde Canoe Family. She will attend Chemawa Indian School as a sophomore in the fall.
