Book review: "Out of the Easy"

Ruta Sepetys is a writer, as well as a musician although in college she majored in International Finance. She loves to travel and has visited more than 42 countries on six continents. She has written two novels, "Out of the Easy" and "Between Shades of Gray."

"Out of the Easy" is about a teenager who wants more out of life than the Big Easy has to offer. Yet living in New Orleans, a place full of secrets, she finds herself in the middle of an investigation that challenges everything she knows, including her relationships.

Josie Moraine is the teenager growing up in New Orleans in the 1950s. This book is a historical fiction novel that tries to show what was happening around this time in New Orleans.
