## Are you pregnant or plan on getting pregnant?

If you are pregnant or plan to become pregnant and are eligible for the Skookum Health Assistance Program (SHAP), this is important information for you. If you do not have primary health insurance coverage and are pregnant, you will need to apply for coverage through your state's assistance program and provide documentation about your eligibility before claims will be paid by SHAP. Most states have special programs for pregnant women and children.
