

Food Bank provides boxes, seeks help

If you receive SNAP, TANF, SSI or LIHEAP assistance, you automatically qualify for assistance at the Grand Ronde Food Bank, 9675 Grand Ronde Road.

Upcoming food box distributions are scheduled for 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Thursday, July 2; 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday, July 11; 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Friday, July 17; 3 to 7 p.m. Wednesday, July 22; and 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Friday, July 31. The food bank is closed on Friday, July 3, in observance of the Fourth of July.

No one will be turned away in need of a food box.

Those who are unable to pick up a food box may fill out an authorized representative form and that person can pick up a food box on your behalf. The authorization is good for one year.

The Grand Ronde Food Bank – *iskam mək'mək haws* – is run by Marion-Polk Food Share, which has been leading the fight to end hunger since 1987 because no one should be hungry.

“It takes a community to fight local hunger,” says Food Bank Coordinator Francene Ambrose. “Your gift of time and talent means so much to individuals, families and children who are struggling. We are looking for assistance in repacking food, putting food on the shelves, handing out food boxes on distribution days and end-of-the-month inventory. Groups are welcome and other opportunities are available.”

Tribal Council OK four grant applications

Tribal Council approved applying for four grants during its Wednesday, June 17, meeting.

The largest grant applied for – \$150,000 from Spirit Mountain Community Fund’s Tribal Grant program – would help design and build a community building in Grand Ronde that could be used by community programs and organizations, including partial use by a local church.

Other grants applied for include \$33,207 in funding from the Natural Resources Conservation Service to conduct early seral habitat enhancement projects on two of the Reservation’s elk meadows and on portions of the Thomson and South Yamhill properties, a \$62,500 Oregon Emergency Management Performance grant that would cover part of the Emergency Operations coordinator and a half-time assistant, trainings and event exercises, supplies and communications equipment, and a \$107,360 Transportation and Growth Management grant that would cover the cost of updating or replacing the Tribe’s 2007 Transportation System Plan.

In other action, Tribal Council approved a memorandum of agreement between the Portland Harbor Natural Resources Trustees and the Freshwater Trust, which provides for Tribal oversight and input, as well as associated funding, on a potential project benefitting Tribally important species such as salmon and lamprey near West Hayden Island.

Tribal Council also approved the enrollment of five applicants into the Tribe.

Land and Culture Department employees Michael Karnosh, David Harrelson and Jordan Mercier performed the cultural drumming and singing to open the meeting.

A Cause For Paws, operated by Joni Kucewicz, distributes free dog and cat food between 10 and 11 a.m. Fridays in the back parking lot of Bonanza Antique Mall at the corner of Grand Ronde Road and Highway 18.

“I buy pet food with all the proceeds I receive from selling collectibles in a booth I rent at the antique store,” Kucewicz says. “I also receive pet food donations from several caring individuals in the community and a business in McMinnville occasionally. I set up a big rummage sale in July and buy pet food with all the proceeds from that, too.”

Kucewicz started A Cause For Paws in September 2013 and to date 40 people have signed up.

“I feel many people are able to keep their pets because they know they have a resource for food for them,” she added. “Anyone is welcome.”
