Book review: “Dream Animals, A Bedtime Journey”

When I first picked up this book I couldn’t put it down. The illustrations were so artistic; they’re whimsical with a vintage feel. After I went back and read the story, I loved the rhyming storytelling, perfect for a peaceful children’s bedtime story and it’s not long with too many pages; just very simplistic and perfect in my opinion.

What adds even more beauty to this book is the idea behind the story: “You only have to close your eyes and when you snuggle in you’ll be carried to your dreams tonight on a wing or paw or fin.” Encouraging children to imagine what their dream animal may be, where would they go, what would they do?

My children outgrew bedtime stories quite a while ago, but this book is so amazing, I couldn’t make myself leave it in the store! There is also a second book called “Day Dreamers, A Journey of Imagination.”

The author/illustrator is Emily Winfield Martin, who lives in Portland, Ore. Her store, The Black Apple, has been featured in national publications and on television, including the New York Times and “The Martha Stewart Show.”
