**Institute of Museums & Library Services:** We are pleased to announce that the Tribal Library recently received notice that our application for an IMLS grant will be awarded effective Aug. 1, 2015, through July 31, 2016. The funding will be used to support new programs in the library geared to technology. We will be purchasing e-readers for library use and training, and a gaming system and E-T games for it. Later in the year we will host a family night featuring our new tools. Our appreciation for everyone who completed the Library Technology Needs Assessment. Results of the assessment will be considered when we purchase the new systems.

**Back-to-School:** School start-up is just around the corner. The library has new books for all ages to kick off this event and we will be passing out "School Is Cool" bookmarks to students who visit the library during the first week of school.
