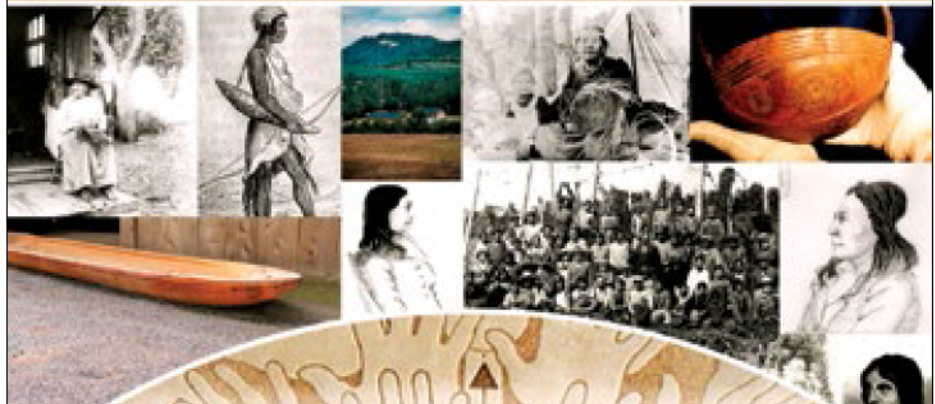


Name changes in Tribal Court

"Between the grand opening of Tilikum Crossing in Portland, Tribal Election Day and then the Sept. 13 General Council meeting, much will have to be written by the Publications staff when we return to the office on Monday, Sept. 14. Delaying publication by a day will give us a chance to get timely coverage of all of those important events in *Smoke Signals* and also have the breathing room to do it properly."
