

Food Bank provides boxes, seeks help

If you receive SNAP, TANF, SSI or LIHEAP assistance, you automatically qualify for assistance at the Grand Ronde Food Bank, 9675 Grand Ronde Road.

Upcoming food box distributions are scheduled for 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Friday, Sept. 4; 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 12; 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Friday, Sept. 18; and 2 to 6 p.m. Wednesday, Sept. 23.

No one will be turned away in need of a food box.

Those who are unable to pick up a food box may fill out an authorized representative form and that person can pick up a food box on your behalf. The authorization is good for one year.

The Grand Ronde Food Bank – iskam məkʰmək haws – is run by Marion-Polk Food Share, which has been leading the fight to end hunger since 1987 because no one should be hungry.

“It takes a community to fight local hunger,” says Food Bank Coordinator Francene Ambrose. “Your gift of time and talent means so much to individuals, families and children who are struggling. We are looking for assistance in repacking food, putting food on the shelves, handing out food boxes on distribution days and end-of-the-month inventory. Groups are welcome and other opportunities are available.”

Call on non-distribution days to ensure someone is available to assist you. You also can sign up for a monthly e-mail for the Food Bank calendar and events, as well as follow the Food Bank on Facebook.

Willamina man arrested for attempted C-store robbery

Grand Ronde Tribal Police arrested Logan Dalton Scoyne, 20, of Willamina on Sunday, Aug. 23, for his alleged attempt to rob Grand Ronde Station on Friday, Aug. 21.

According to the Grand Ronde Tribal Police Department, a masked male entered the convenience store near Spirit Mountain Casino at 1:08 a.m. Friday, Aug. 21, brandished a handgun and demanded money. He then fled on foot.

After the arrival of casino security personnel, Tribal Police Officer Tyler Brown responded to the armed robbery call and along with Yamhill County Deputy Marc Brodeur conducted a search for the suspect, who was not found.

Through Friday and Saturday, Grand Ronde Tribal Police Officers Rod McAllister and Tim Hernandez and Sgt. Jake McKnight assisted in the investigation with help from

Spirit Mountain Casino’s surveillance team. They identified the suspect as well as obtained a search warrant for Scoyne’s vehicle.

On the evening of Saturday, Aug. 22, Brown and McAllister with the assistance of Polk County Sgt. Tyrone Jenkins and Deputy Casey Gibson and Yamhill County deputies Jerry Druery, Jacob Herr and Richard Broyles, served a search warrant and arrested Scoyne on seven charges in the early morning of Sunday, Aug. 23.

Scoyne, 20, was lodged in the Polk County Jail in Dallas on the charges of attempted assault on the first degree, menacing, recklessly endangering, unlawful use of a weapon, attempted robbery in the first degree, disorderly conduct and second degree robbery. His bail is set at \$47,500.

According to his Facebook page, Scoyne is 2013 graduate of Willamina High School. ■
