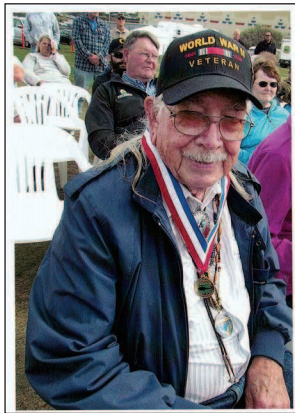


## Hudson receives Oregon Veterans Medal

Tribal Elder Herman Hudson, 90, received an Oregon Veterans Medal during a presentation held in late September at Chinook Winds Casino Resort in Lincoln City.



The annual Celebration of Honor recognizes active duty personnel, military veterans and their families.

The event also included a Ride of Honor led by the Oregon Coast Veterans Association and the re-dedication of the Desert Storm Memorial in front of the casino.

Hudson served in the U.S. Navy from 1942 to 1945. He went to high school in Keizer and Salem until his junior year at Salem's North High School, when he joined the Navy.

"It was during the war, you know, and that was what you did, I guess," he told *Smoke Signals* in 2013. "My uncles that I was closest to went into the service, so I did, too."

The Navy took Hudson to the South Pacific, where he said he was on "the deck force." That means, he said, he scrubbed the decks.

In the service, he also learned to cut hair. The ship's regular barber was shipping out, so he taught Hudson to cut hair and the Navy was a good proving ground. "Out in the South Pacific," he said, "they didn't care much about how their hair looked."

His ship escorted fleet oilers. "We'd tie up alongside that oiler, and I took my (hair cutting) box out and put a can out if they wanted to throw something in."

The Oregon Veterans Medal is a custom-designed medal that signifies Oregon's appreciation for the service and sacrifice of veterans. To qualify, an application form at [www.veteransoforegon.com](http://www.veteransoforegon.com) must be completed with proof of military service attached. ■

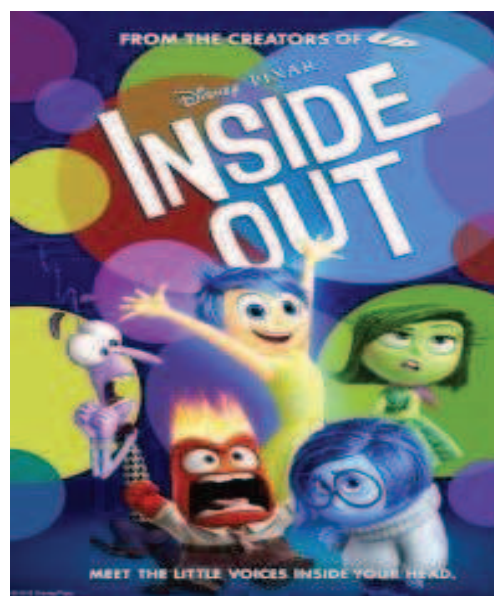
## Special Event Board seeking help from younger veterans
