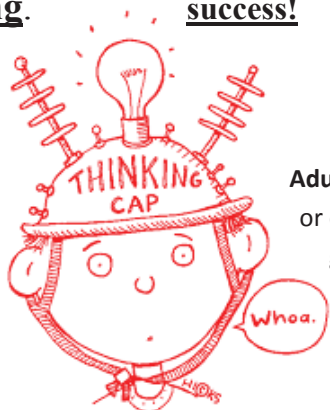
**Reminder:** Donated items must be clean and in good condition.
