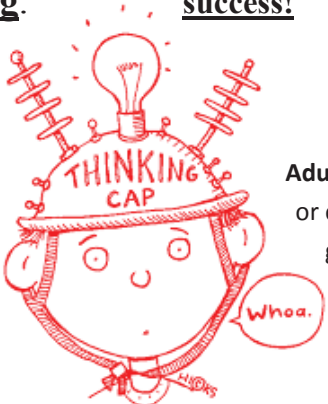
Reminder: Donated items must be clean and in good condition.
