Book review: "Dark Endeavor" by Kenneth Oppel

"Dark Endeavor" is the first book of a two-book series based on the early days of Victor Frankenstein. Victor and Konrad are twin brothers who are nearly inseparable. Growing up, their lives are filled with imagination, learning and adventures until the day their adventures turn all too real.

Victor begins to struggle with inner demons, but he knows he must not fail. His success depends on how far he is willing to push the boundaries of nature and science, and how much he is willing to sacrifice.

This author, Kenneth Oppel, surprised me with how gothic and stylishly written the book is with every word jumping with action as you read. I loved that the story was set in the early era at the Frankenstein family castle. I really enjoyed this book and look forward to the second book in the series. — **Rachelle Kellogg**

Eligibility Criteria/Intake Policy
 All students enrolled in the program must meet the eligibility guidelines listed below & provide proof of the following when applying:

- Student must be enrolled in kindergarten through fifth grade during the 2015-16 school year
- Tribal affiliation: Must be an enrolled member of CTGR (please provide a copy of Tribal ID or CIB), a CTGR descendant or other Native.
- Service Area: Students must reside in one of the six County service areas (Polk, Marion, Multnomah, Tillamook, Washington, Yamhill)
