This year, teens will have the option to purchase gift cards or prizes with their book bucks.

Book review: “Who Will Tell My Brother” by Marlene Carvell.

High school can be tough and uncomfortable for some. This book gives you a close-up, detailed look into Evan Hill's senior year. He is a Mohawk Native American dealing with bullying, traditions and bigotry.

Also interesting is how the author took this book and turned it into poetry of sort, with words that touch you and stir emotion. Like this passage: “I long to go home. It's tough being noble when you're all alone.” I find the author's words soft as silk, yet as powerful as a lion.

I found myself cheering for the narrator from the beginning. Evan's exceptional commitment to his cause touched me so deeply that I had to evaluate what I would have said or how I would have reacted in the situations he was faced with. This struggle is very much an issue for our culture and way of life. It is a struggle that will continue as long as people see others as different.

I hoped the book's ending was different, but I was still very happy to have read and pondered “Who Will Tell My Brother,” which is a young adult fiction novel. Therefore, I formally invite you to come to the Tribal Library to check out this book. — *By Rachelle Kellogg*

Eligibility Criteria/Intake Policy
 All students enrolled in the program must meet the eligibility guidelines listed below & provide proof of the following when applying:
 • Student must be enrolled in kindergarten through fifth grade during the 2015-16 school year
 • Tribal affiliation: Must be an enrolled member of CTGR (please provide a copy of Tribal ID or CIB), a CTGR descendant or other Native.
 • Service Area: Students must reside in one of the six County service areas (Polk, Marion, Multnomah, Tillamook, Washington, Yamhill)
