A HEARING WILL BE HELD ON: July 19, 2016, at 1:30 p.m., at the Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde, Juvenile Court, which is located at 9615 Grand Ronde Road, Grand Ronde, Oregon 97347, wherein the Court will hear evidence and issue an Order concerning S.E.M, a legal child of Thomas Etier.

Your rights may be affected in this proceeding. Certain persons have been proposed to be appointed as the child's legal guardians. If you fail to appear at the time and place indicated above, the Court may appoint legal guardians for your legal child, and may take any other action that is authorized by law. The Court may proceed with this hearing whether or not you are present.

You have the right to be present at the hearing, to present evidence and to be represented by an attorney. If you have any questions, you should seek an attorney immediately. If you cannot afford an attorney, one may be appointed for you at the Tribe's expense upon your request and upon the Court's determination of indigence.
