Scholarships available for Native American students

The Oregon Community Foundation, which annually awards more than \$9.7 million in scholarships to Oregon students through its statewide scholarship program, has two scholarships that specifically target Native American students.

The Verl and Dorothy Miller Native American Scholarship is for students, including Native Americans, who are residents of Oregon attending or planning to attend an accredited trade or vocational school in Oregon. The awards are for \$3,000 per year and are renewable, but students need to re-apply annually.

The Howard Vollum American Indian Scholarship is for eligible students, including Native American residents of Clackamas, Multnomah, Washington and Clark (Wash.) counties seeking post-secondary education or training in science, technology, engineering or mathematics. Awards are for \$3,000 a year and are renewable, but students must re-apply each year.

Preference is given to students who have demonstrated commitment to and involvement in their Native American community. Students must be enrolled in a Tribe or descendants of enrolled Tribal members.

To apply, visit www.oregoncf.org/receive/scholarships/scholarship-opportunities. Deadline for applications is March 1 for the 2017-18 academic year.

Google Scholarship seeking Native applicants

Generation Google Scholarship is seeking underrepresented minorities interested in computer science to apply for its scholarships.

Applicants must be a current high school senior who intends to enroll as a full-time student at a university in the United States or Canada in 2017-18.

Students must be from an underrepresented group, such as Native American, African American, Hispanic, Filipino/Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, female or a person with a disability.

Applicants must exemplify leadership and demonstrate a passion for computer science and technology, exhibit a strong record of academic achievement and be available to attend Google's Computer Science Institute in the summer.

Deadline to apply is Thursday, March 2.

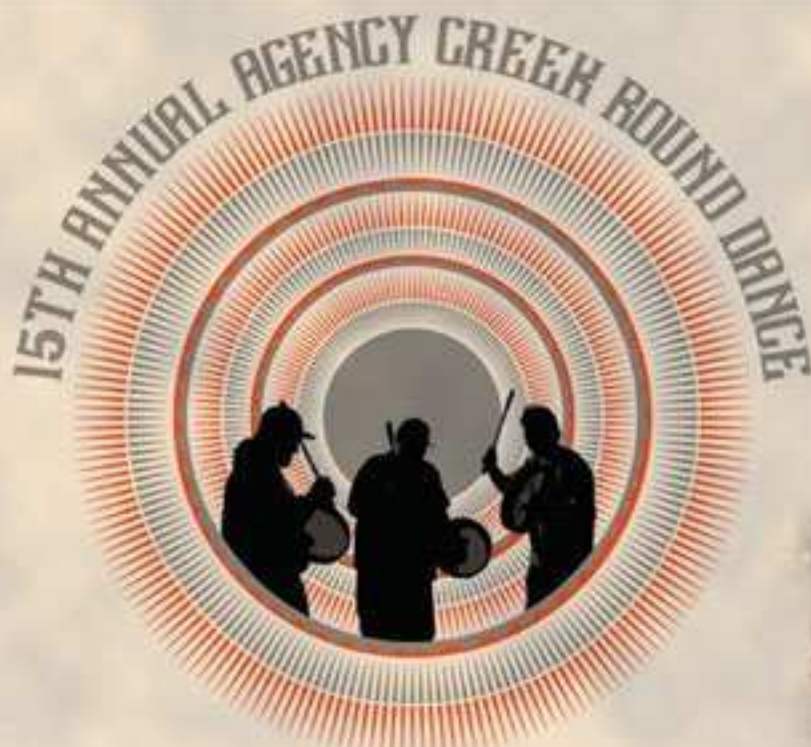
