**Book review:** "11/22/63": Stephen King writes about how a high school teacher named Jake Epping in Maine who travels back in time to prevent the assassination of John F. Kennedy. Jake's favorite place to grab a piece of pie is at the local soon-to-be-bought-out town diner of his best friend. The owner of the diner/time machine is Al Templeton, who is running out of time due to lung cancer.

After Al's first conversation in a long time with Jake, he realizes that Jake is the one who can prevent it. Al invites Jake to a free dinner to discuss something important. Asking Jake if he trusts him, he sends Jake to the diner's pantry/time machine and says keep going all the way to the back of the room. Jake thinks Al is crazy for this, but then he steps into 1958 at 11:58 a.m. and the great smell of sulfur arises.

Al then convinces the English teacher to go back in time and stop Lee Harvey Oswald from shooting Kennedy. Having to stay in Lisbon Falls for five years was going to be a long time and that had worried Jake, but Al then mentions that whenever he steps into the "rabbit hole" only two minutes pass in present time, no matter how long he stays there.

Jake going into the past soon realizes that knowing the future can either help him or put him in danger. With romance and parts of the book that make you move to the edge of your seat, this book is a slow start but once you get going into the details it will hook you and you will not want to stop.

## Willamina district offering free meals during summer


Every year, the U.S. Department of Agriculture partners with the Willamina School District to provide free meals to children when school is not in session during the summer.
