The proposed amendments make significant revisions to the Ordinance to update and clarify Ordinance provisions. The Ordinance was adopted in 1993, has not been amended and is very out-of-date. The proposed amendments may also include minor technical (i.e., formatting, typographical, housekeeping) modifications.

The proposed amendments made several changes to the Ordinance including but not limited to removing all provisions related to Birth Certification, renaming the Ordinance to the Name Change Ordinance, and updating and clarifying name change provisions. The proposed amendments may also include minor technical (i.e., formatting, typographical, housekeeping) modifications.

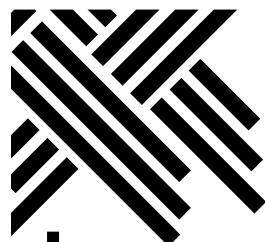
### TOBACCO ORDINANCE OPEN FOR COMMENT

The proposed amendments establish that it is a violation to sell or distribute tobacco to anyone under the age of 21 on the Reservation. The proposed amendments may also include minor technical (i.e., formatting, typographical, housekeeping) modifications.
